

Sunday, September 1, 2024 — Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time: To whom shall we go? If a little is good, wouldn't more be better? That seems to be the underlying logic of the Pharisees and scribes in today's Gospel reading. They saw the purity rules from the Law of Moses as a good thing; and, they were. These rules set God's people apart among the nations and were meant to form His own character in them. But the thirst for "more" of a good thing led to the addition of extra rituals for washing and purification over the centuries. And by the time these Pharisees confronted Jesus about His disciples' behavior, they were trying to uphold countless detailed, but unwritten customs, that were considered by some to be just as binding as the Mosaic law. In the end, these attempts to revere God turned into what Jesus called "cling[ing] to human tradition". Jesus' response gets to the heart of the matter — our hearts! What we eat and how we wash our hands doesn't make us unclean. We defile ourselves by our thoughts, words, and actions that spring from within us. Growing in purity and Godliness starts in our hearts and moves into our words and actions from there. That means that the answer to your thirst for holiness isn't about adding more "rules" to help you become even more pure. It's about asking yourself questions like, "What's going on in my heart? What's motivating me? What's the *right* thing to do? What would Jesus do?" If you see sinful attitudes, repent. Let the Lord uproot them and replace them with His own thoughts and desires. Then receive God's power to change as you set your heart on loving Him and loving the people He's put into your life. That's how you can get *more* of a good thing!

"Lord, help me to follow you with all of my heart."

CCD Schedule for Wednesday, September 4, 2024, 6:30 PM

St. Anthony begins with Mass; Confession Grades 10-12 St.Lawrence begins with Eucharistic Adoration/Devotional; Grades 11-12

For St. Lawrence CCD: When classes begin with Mass, St. Elizabeth School will NOT be open until AFTER Mass is over; therefore, no supervision for children if they are dropped off at school before Mass is over. ALSO, St. Lawrence will be employing the following new safety measures: For this CCD Program Year, the street directly in front of St. Elizabeth School will not allow thru traffic from 6:45 PM to 8:15 PM. This is to promote safety and awareness for everyone, especially students. The school street intersections, both East and West ends, will be marked with lighted traffic cones and, for at least the first two weeks, will have Crossing Guards with reflective vests and lighted traffic wands. The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) is an apprenticeship in living the Christian life in the Catholic Church. Candidates experience a gradual process of conversion and spiritual formation through times of prayer, study, reflection, faith sharing, ongoing discernment, and participation in the life of the parish. The rite involves four elements: Word/Scripture, Worship/Liturgy, Community, and Service. Classes will begin early October 2024 and end in April 2025. This ministry is for those who want to become Catholic and/or those who need to complete the Sacraments, such as Confirmation. Classes consist of meeting for 2 hours on a weekly basis with Father Aubuchon. Missouri Catholic Conference Statement on Amendment 3

August 13, 2024, Jefferson City, MO - Amendment 3, which will appear on Missouri's November 2024 ballot, is an extreme constitutional amendment legalizes abortion at any stage of pregnancy with no protections for the preborn child, even when the child is capable of feeling pain. The amendment would effectively repeal long-standing health and safety standards for women. These include basic health and safety requirements for clinics where abortions are performed, requiring a physician to perform abortions, informed consent requirements, laws prohibiting public funding of abortion, and parental consent requirements before a minor's abortion.

The Missouri Catholic Conference will be working to inform the public about this deceptively worded amendment. We urge all Missourians of good will to stand for the health & safety of women and their preborn children & oppose Amendment 3.
