We get a glimpse today of the mind of God for His people in that it is not good for us to be alone. Into our solitude, God provides companions and we are created to find our meaning & fulfillment in relationships. Our Creator is passionate about being in relationship, especially with us. In the Gospel, Jesus first talks about the integrity and importance of marriage, and fidelity in marriage, and then talks about children and letting the children come to Him. This is why the Church is so strongly against divorce, and so strongly pro-life. Strong marriages are necessary for strong families. As we observe Respect Life Sunday, think about how Christ's sacrifice on The Cross gives dignity and meaning to all human life from conception to death. In the prophet Jeremiah, God says, before I formed you in the womb, I called you. Notice how God accompanies us from conception to death. And He calls us to accompany each other in the same way, with mercy and with love, supporting families before, during, and after pregnancy. We have many ministries of mercy, but the truth is that we need more. Every Christian man and woman are called to imitate the Heavenly Father in a ministry of mercy to support and accompany others, especially pregnant women and single mothers.

The Gospel of Life demands we speak out on the moral issue that is Amendment 3. Amendment 3 is a constitutional amendment for the State of Missouri. Meaning, if it passes, it will be beyond the reach of the legislature. This Amendment will prohibit the legislature from outlawing or even regulating abortions before viability. Beyond point of viability; generally understood to be 6 months after the baby is conceived, the abortion Amendment says the state government can regulate but cannot prohibit abortion. So it would allow for abortion over the whole 9 months of pregnancy. The Amendment would override safeguards in Missouri law that help protect women from unsafe abortions, for example, that abortion clinics comply with the state's health and safety standards for outpatient surgical centers and be located close enough to a hospital that a woman can get treatment if life-threatening complications arise. It also overrides the current law that parents of a minor be notified before their daughter can have an abortion. The Amendment only requires a healthcare professional to perform the abortion procedure, which could include a Physician Assistant, a pharmacist, or even a dental hygienist. The Catholic Missourian has some great articles regarding Amendment 3. I strongly encourage you to read them and to inform yourselves on this issue. Don't be afraid to let people know, calmly and with mercy, your thoughts on this Amendment. Speak with mercy and love, and be a light for others. Jesus says still today, let the children come to me. Let the Church be pro-life. Let's walk together, as little children, to Jesus, who knitted us together in the womb, who knows and loves us from the womb. Let us strive to know and love from the womb, too.
